## GRANT REQUIREMENTS

Grant program is open to registered pro-life groups (undergraduate, graduate, law school, med school, etc.) at any college or university in the state of Wisconsin.

Group members must have a strong dedication to advancing the culture of life throughout their college career.

Group members should have some prior leadership experience and/or be willing to further develop their leadership skills.

If a right-to-life organization is not yet established on campus, the recipient will be required to submit all necessary paperwork to the college or university to develop a student-led group, and find a faculty advisor, with the help of their Field Representative through WRTL.

Groups must organize projects or events on their campus throughout the year in order to raise awareness of right-to-life issues.

The relationship between WRTL and the group should be publicized in events/any advertising done using grant money. Life on Campus logo can be found at <a href="https://www.wtrl.org/life-on-campus">wtrl.org/life-on-campus</a>.

Recipients must commit to attending a number of WRTL trainings & events (see next page).





## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Grant money is paid directly to the group for funding pro-life projects. Recipients will receive three grant payments of equal amounts in the Fall, Winter, and Spring. Each disbursement is dependent on the recipient staying in contact with the WRTL Field Rep and keeping them up to date on what is happening on campus.

In order to thoroughly prepare group members to be pro-life leaders on their campus, recipients are required to send at least one member attend the following events throughout the school year:

- State Conference
- Meetings throughout the school year with a WRTL Field Representative to help plan events or to answer questions.

Groups must host/participate in at least one visible event (volunteering, supporting a local pregnancy center, etc.) throughout the year. Visit wrtl.org/life-on-campus or contact your Field Representative for ideas.

Grants are good for one full school year. Groups must re-apply to be considered for a grant for the following school year.
